

As geography instructor, Mr. Specht created much interest among the students in this field. He has planned and guided the cross-country trips offered every year during summer school.




Entering photography contests has been a successful pastime for this trophy winner. His membership in various photography clubs provides the relaxation that must come after a hard day at the "maps".


And finally, remember graduation day with all its solemnness? As the pages of this IRIS are flipped over, the by-gone year at Central State College will be relived "through the camera lens."





The pipes of Pan on each side of the globe, the scroll and the violin exemplify the other side of her nature. Two torches shine forth, emblems of light and knowledge, while the dates 1900-1903 mark the years of her service.





And, of course, some of the best dressed girls in school wear the label "This is a homemade original."






Congratulations are in order as Ellie Rostal and Pat Sroda win the badminton tournament.
