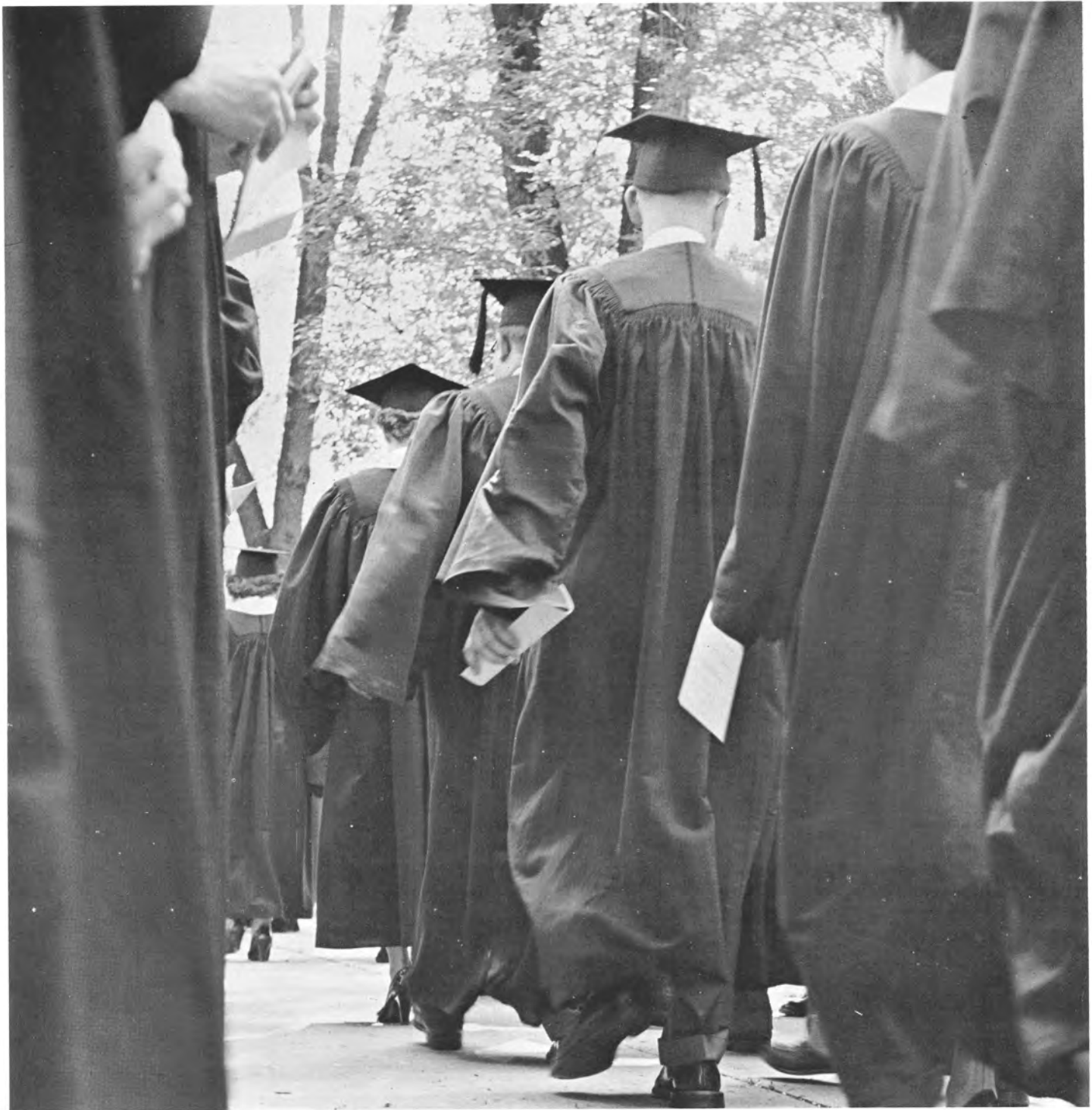

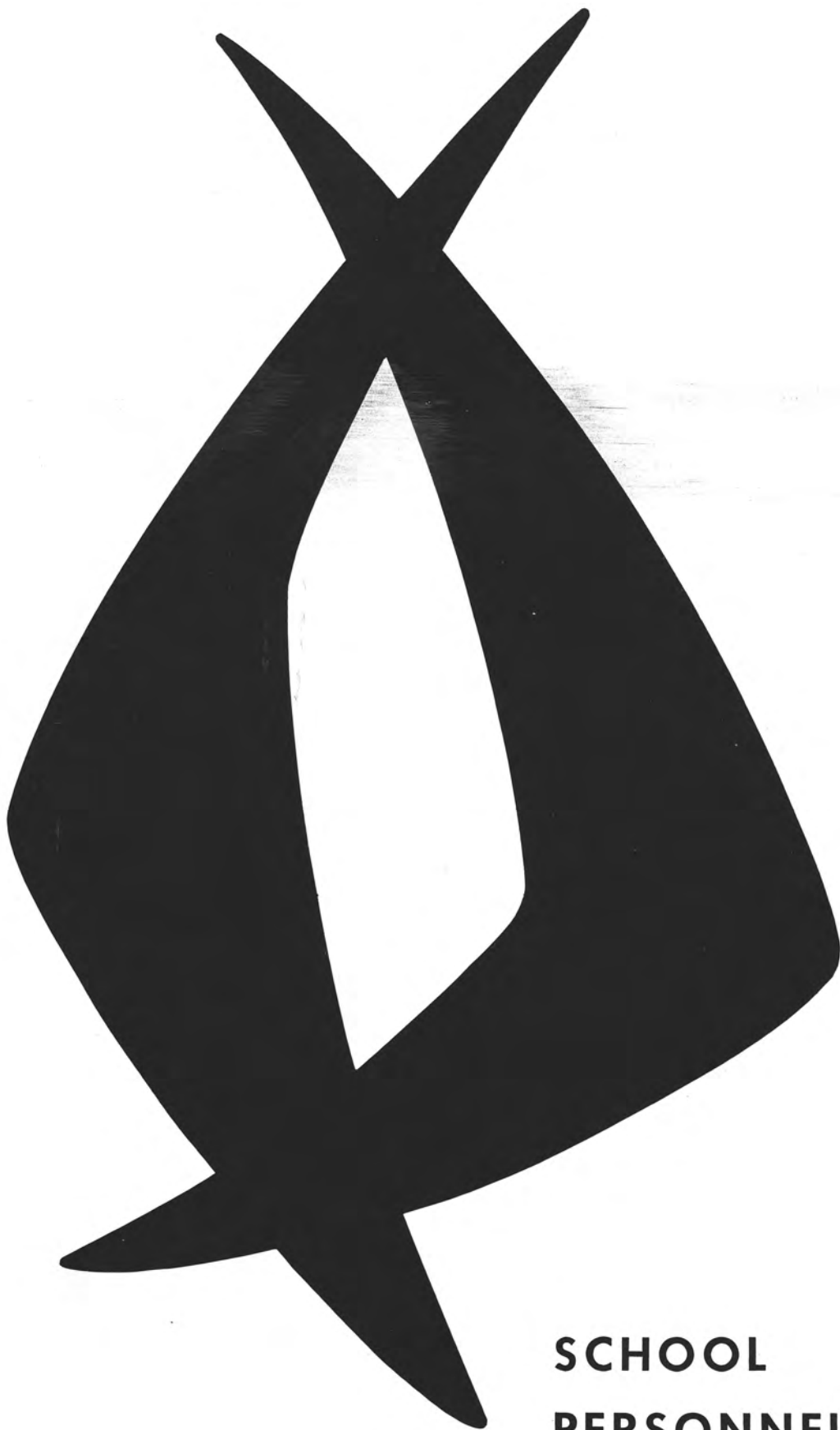

Our President

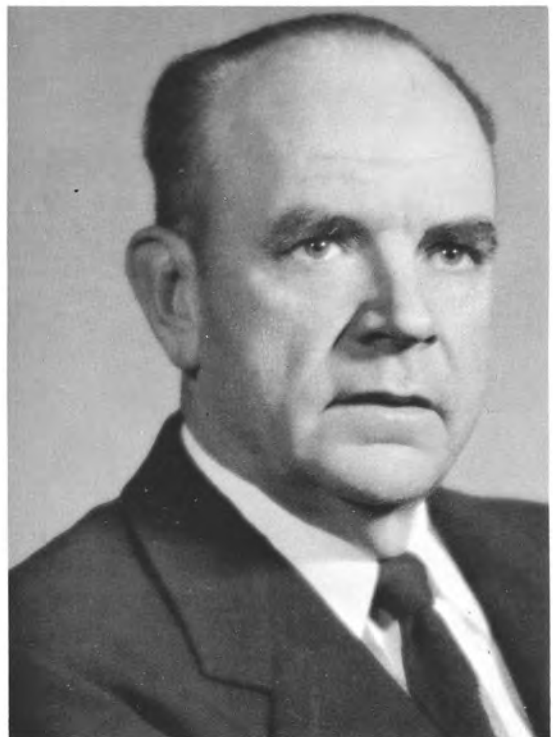

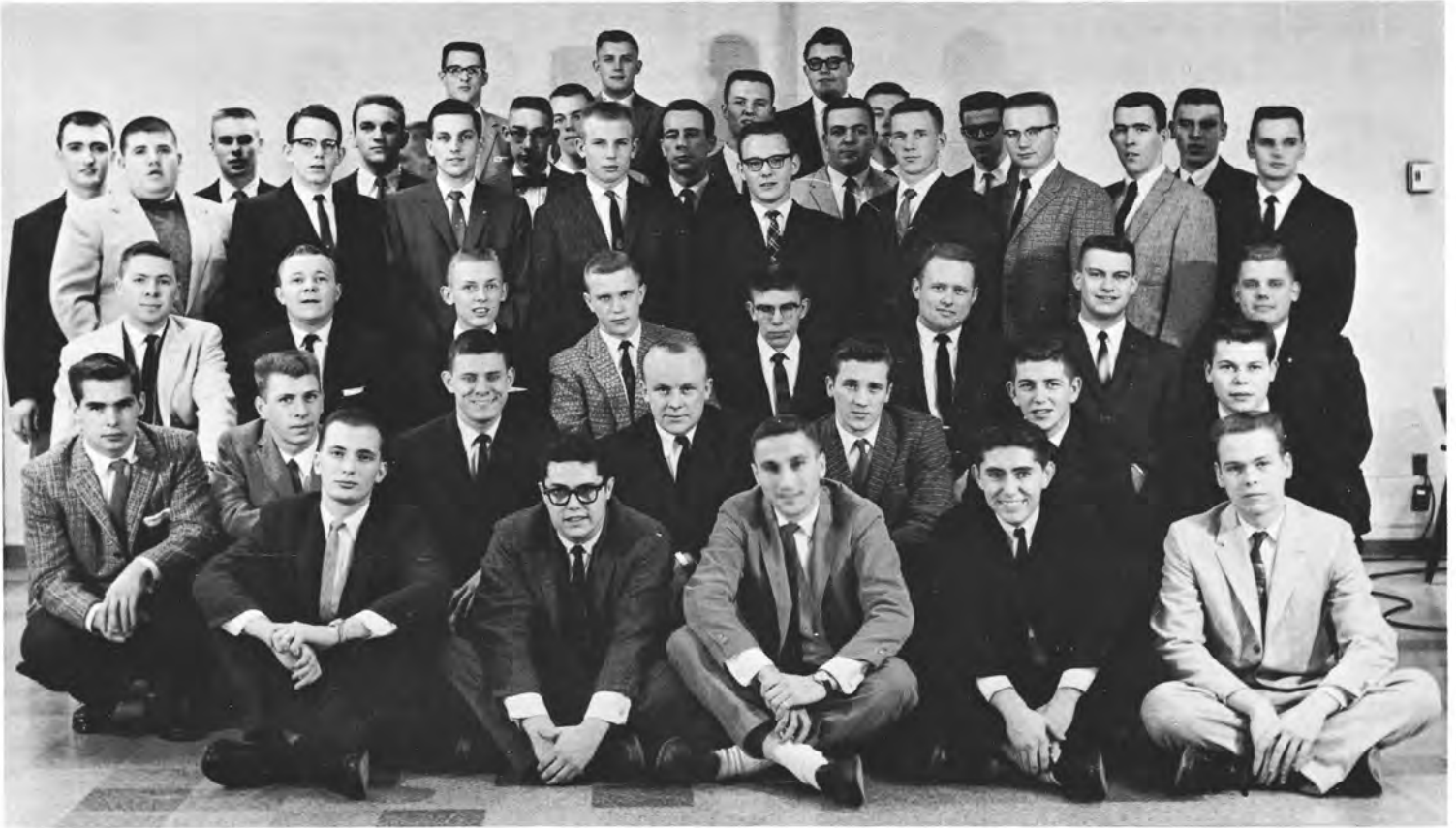

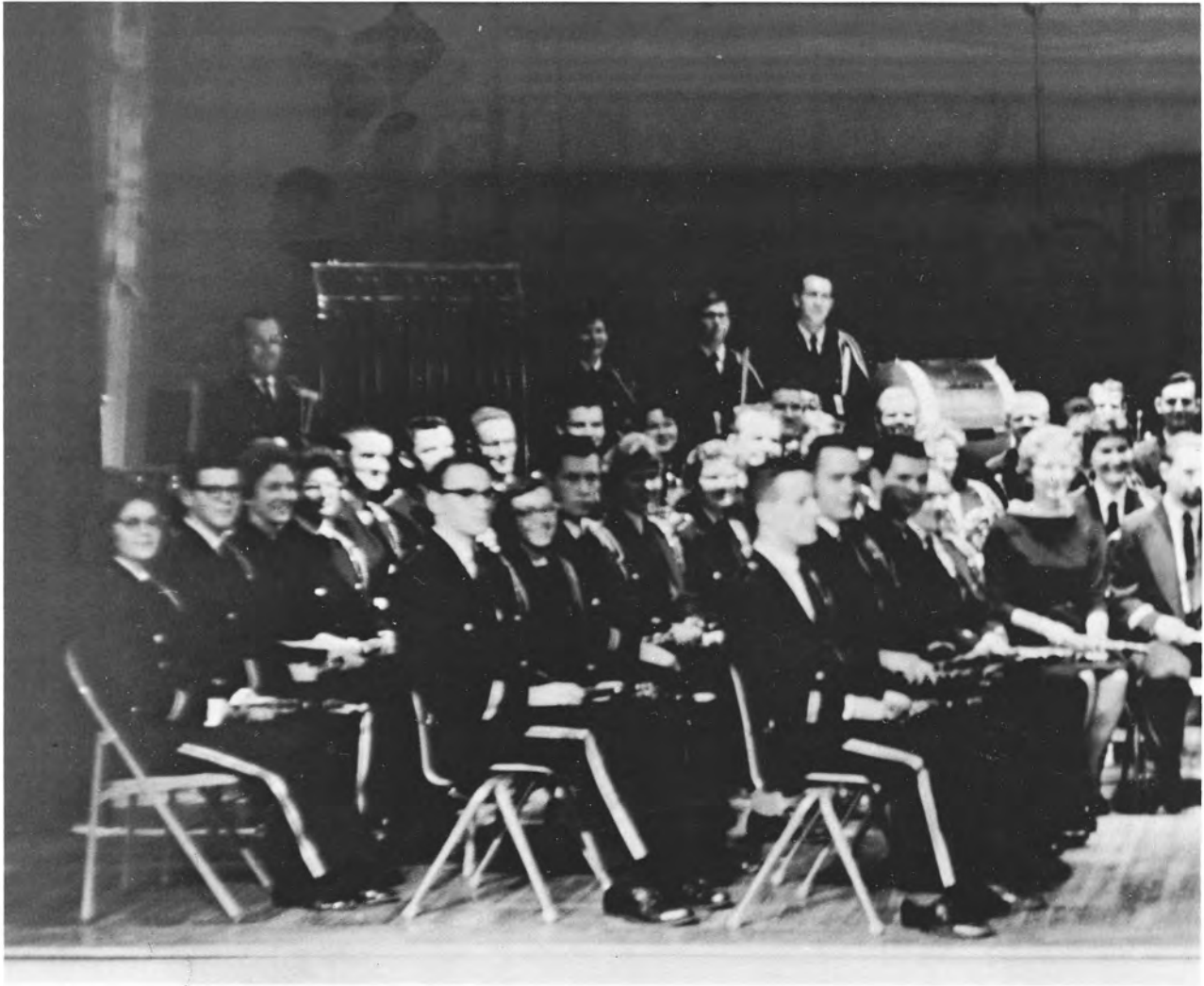

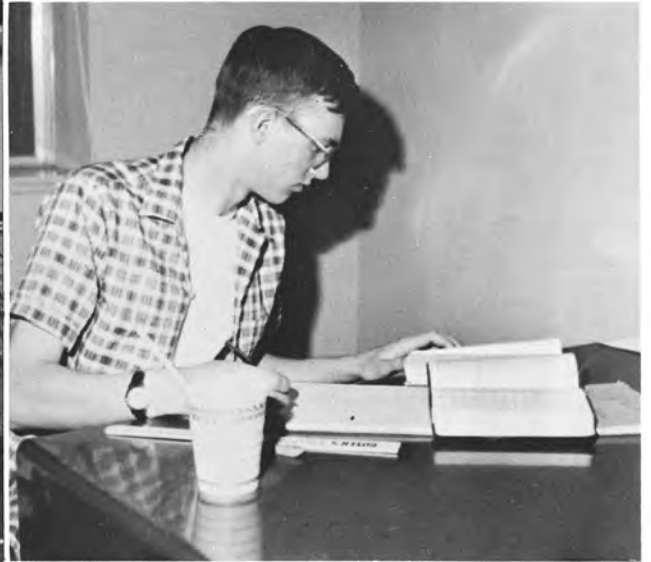
STEINER HALL
