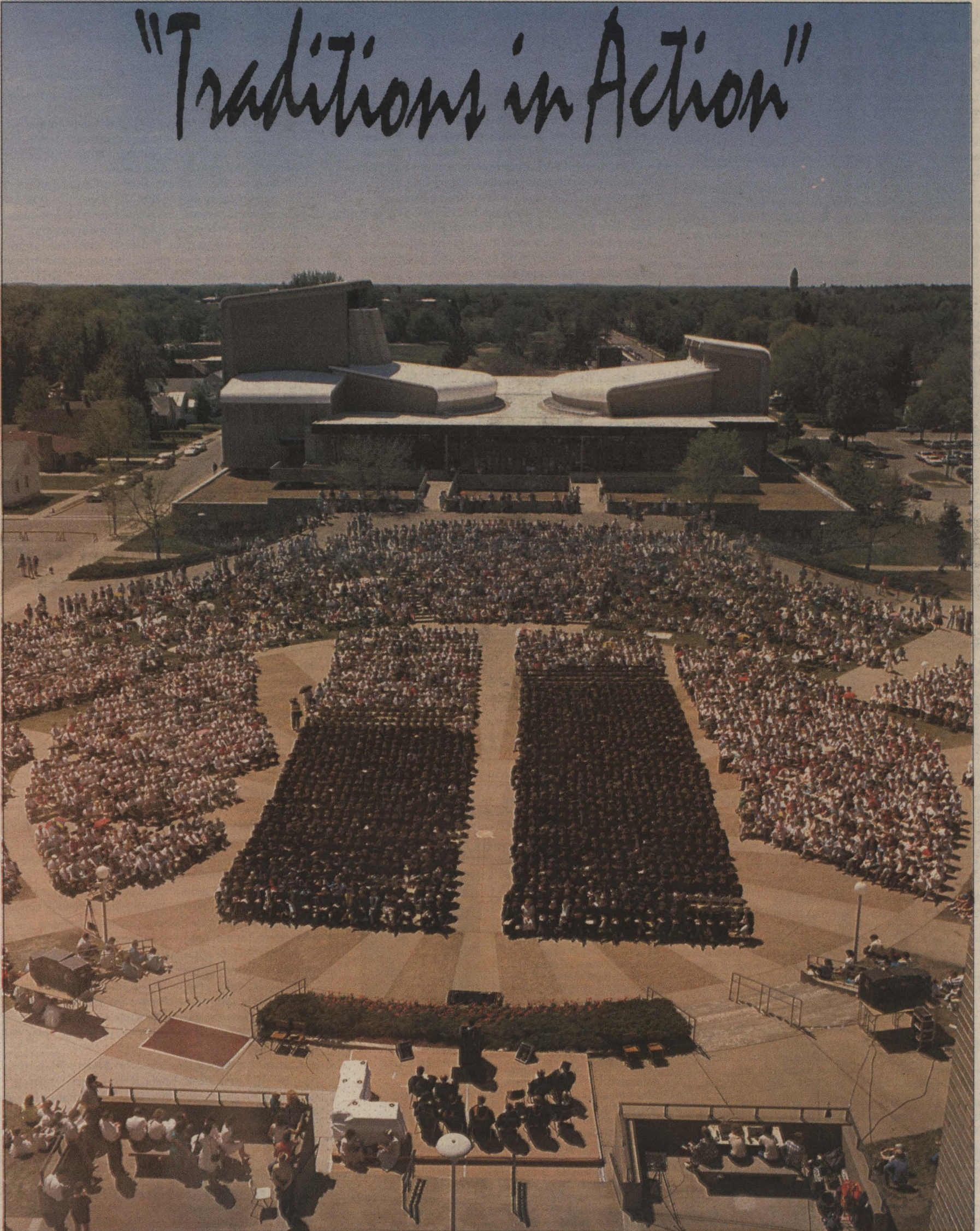

Restoration likely for Nelson Hall

An historic building with an uncertain future will be saved at the UW-SP, if campus officials have their way.

Nelson Hall, the second dormitory constructed in what once was the State Normal School System, is proposed to undergo major interior renovations and exterior restoration.

Carl Rasmussen, director of space management and facilities planning, says the university will request funds for the project during the 1993-95 state biennial budget period. The earliest date work could begin is 1995.

Estimated costs are \$3.2 million, about the same as building a new structure of similar size.

The UW System Board of Regents, the State Building Commission and the Legislature must approve the appropriation, but Rasmussen is hopeful because the regents' staff had initially accepted the proposal more than one year ago, later setting it aside because of financial constraints.

Given the historical considerations, distinctive architectural features, sentiment of alumni, and the fact Nelson is structurally sound, "it would seem to make more sense to renovate than tear down and build new," adds Greg Diemer, UW-SP's assistant chancellor for business affairs.

Opened exactly 75 years ago last February, the three-story structure with a partially exposed basement is proposed to have new plumbing, air

conditioning, electrical and heating installations plus an elevator and major redecorating and remodeling.

The existing windows would be replaced and the front porch would be rebuilt. Even a large wooden swing hanging inside the porch would be restored.

Originally a dormitory for women, the hall has had many diverse uses through its history and most recently has been home to the Foreign Student Programs, English Language Institute, Child Learning and Care Center, Women's Resource Center, University Graphics and Photography Office, Groundwater Center, and an overflow quarters for programs in other parts of the campus.

Little more than a year after its opening in 1917, the young women residing there were asked to find accommodations elsewhere in the community to make way for the Student Army Training Corps, which had been organized for the purpose of preparing officers for World War I.

Robert Andrews, 93, of 1213 Division St., Stevens Point, was the last known survivor of that 100-plus member corps. He recalled that the young soldiers ate and slept in the hall and did their training at the present site of Goerke Park.

Twenty-five years later, the women residents were once again asked to move out, making room this time for a group of World War II trainees.

Nelson remained a dormitory until 1968, when the

need for office space necessitated its transfer to the headquarters for English, conservation/natural resources, Reserve Officer Training Corps and other faculty. Because of the military's presence there, the building was the site of a weekend sit-in by students protesting the Vietnam War in 1971.

It was an office and dormitory, off and on, until its present occupants moved into the upper floors in 1988.

Many social events on campus have been held in Nelson through the years, including dances and innumerable tea parties. Professor and Mrs. Joseph V. Collins celebrated their golden wedding anniversary there in the late 1930s.

Despite being a gathering place for years, its days as an early dormitory were marked with strict regulations for the occupants. No men callers could go beyond the first floor, K.B. Willett of 1948 Plover St. has recalled at some past alumni events. He has told several audiences how he tried to circumvent the rule during his student days more than 70 years ago and came close to being expelled in the process.

Nelson bears the name of George B. Nelson, a longtime attorney here, who served from 1930 to 1943 on the Wisconsin Supreme Court. Nelson was a regent of the State Normal School System in the period when the dormitory was constructed, beginning late in the year of 1915. ■

News Briefs

Earth-saving missions

Two UW-SP faculty members had prestigious roles during the past summer as representatives of international organizations at the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Baird Callicott, an environmental ethics specialist in the Department of Philosophy, and Rick Wilke, associate dean of the College of Natural Resources, believe they were the only participants from Wisconsin.

Wilke represented the North American Association for Environmental Education and Academy for Educational Development while Callicott was there on behalf of the International Society for Environmental Ethics.

Both professors expressed optimism for the future of the environment because of the determination of officials from so many different countries. However, one of their greatest disappointments was President Bush's failure to sign the biological diversity treaty. Callicott was dismayed by the fact that nothing was said or done about the growing population problem, especially in Third World nations. ■

Students started recycling

The modern day recycling program at UW-SP, which won a national award from the Environmental Protection Agency, stems from student efforts in the Environmental Educators and Naturalist Association.

Chris Langenfeld, '88, wrote to the editor of this publication after the most recent edition carried a story of the EPA award, that "Thanks to a great deal of effort by such students as Erik Oberg, the recycling of aluminum cans was started."

Langenfeld said the student association had little support from university personnel in its efforts, and in some cases met outright resistance to the effort. But it persevered, and focused primarily on aluminum recycling. ■

Campus becomes more diverse

UW-SP has a more culturally diverse population than at any other time in its 98-year history.

A total of 279 minority students were signed up for fall semester classes in 1991, a 12 percent increase over the previous year, according to Registrar David Eckholm.

Meanwhile, the numbers of women and the number of minorities on the faculty and staff also are increasing.

The student count includes 52 blacks, up two from last year; 97 Native Americans, up five; 70 Asian/Oriental, up 12; and 60 Hispanics, up 11.

Loretta Webster, associate vice chancellor for the advancement of cultural diversity, said recruitment of students and other Caucasians, who have overwhelmingly dominated the campus population throughout its existence, is extremely competitive.

Nonetheless, officials at UW campuses have been instructed by the Board of Regents to increase their

minority student population by 10 percent each year, according to Webster.

Most of the recruitment is done in the central and eastern sectors of the state. The university continues to maintain a long-standing record of serving one of the largest contingents of Native Americans of any UW institution. Some of its latest successes in attracting more Asians are from the Hmong communities of the region. And the additional Hispanics represent, in part, the area south of Stevens Point where migrant workers began making permanent homes about 40 years ago.

Among the 59 new faculty/academic staff appointees this fall, 32 were women.

Additional successes included the hiring of five new minority members, bringing to 44 the total number on the faculty and staff. Also, three veteran employees were transferred from academic staff to faculty positions. ■

Alumna named regent

An alumna of UW-SP, who joined Fort Howard Paper Co. as a secretary 19 years ago and now holds the position of vice chairman and chief financial officer, has been named to the University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents.

Kathleen (Mottley) Hempel, a 1972 business administration graduate, has been appointed by Gov. Tommy Thompson to a seven-year term on the governing board of the UW System. She also has attended UW-Platteville and has a master's degree from Arizona State University.

Hempel joined the company in 1973 and served as vice president for human resources from 1978 to 1982. She has been on the Fort Howard board of directors since 1979. From 1985 to mid-1986, she represented Hewitt Associates, a management consulting firm in Phoenix, Ariz. She returned to Fort Howard as executive vice president in 1986 and was promoted to senior executive vice president in 1988, making her the highest ranking woman executive in the paper industry.

Hempel is responsible for all financial, legal and management information services and public affairs activities for the company. She has said her background in finance and human resources should benefit the board as the UW-System goes about the job of allocating state resources. She and her husband, Richard Hempel, have two daughters, one in high school, the other in junior high. They live at 2629 Sequoia Lane, Green Bay. ■

Planners chosen for centennial celebration

A 25-member steering committee to plan and stage UW-SP's centennial observance was announced in March at the home of Chancellor and Mrs. Keith Sanders.

Helen Godfrey, assistant chancellor for student development/university relations, was appointed to chair the group.

During a reception for the committee, Sanders asked members to use the anniversary observances as a means of:

- Making the institution and its programs more widely known.
- Promoting positive public attitudes about UW-SP.
- Advancing the recruitment of outstanding students, the raising of funds from private sources and the garnering of more political support.

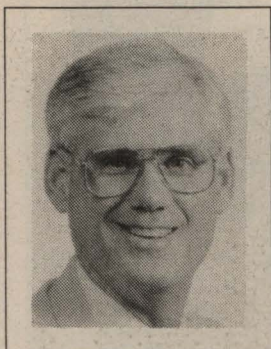
The committee held its first planning session on a Friday afternoon later in March, during which time it began deliberating on Sanders' other charges of choosing a theme, determining the duration of the observance/celebration, establishing a budget, and planning events.

The chancellor said he would like attention drawn during the centennial to the university's quality, innovativeness, the caring attitude by faculty and staff toward students, and the diversity of talent, ideas and people here.

Committee appointees are John Anderson, Mary Ann Baird, Larry Beck, Roger Braun, Jerry Burling, Greg Diekroeger, Karen Engelhard, Dan Fabiano, John Jury, Robert Knowlton, Janet Malone, Peggy Carrier, Terri Taylor, Dennis Tierney, Mary Whalen and Mary Williams, all representing the faculty, academic or classified staffs; Judi Carlson, president of the Alumni Association; Burdette Eagon, Mary Croft, Robert Engelhard and Orland Radke, emeritus faculty; Kelly Kirchoff and Kim Schoenfeld, students; and Marge Warner, representing the community and alumni.

The Board of Regents of State Normal Schools took 101 ballots on July 21, 1893, before agreeing that its sixth institution in Wisconsin should be located in Stevens Point. Construction on Old Main Building began soon thereafter and was completed at a cost of about \$50,000.

The facility opened for the first day of classes on Sept. 17, 1894 with about 200 students in teacher-training courses. ■

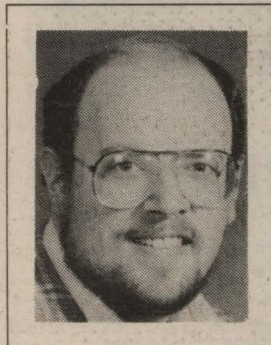

Chancellor's book compares presidential campaigns

Americans daunted by mudslinging in presidential election campaigns would find relief in the way the French use humor in their selection of national leaders, says the chancellor of UW-SP.

Keith R. Sanders is one of three co-editors of a new book, "Mediated Politics in

Two Cultures: Presidential Campaigning in the United States and France."

The work is a study of the similarities and differences between the 1988 campaigns in the two countries, which led to George Bush's victory over Michael Dukakis and Francois Mitterand's defeat of Jacques Chirac.

"Humor is certainly one of the more noticeable differences in presidential races in the two countries," the chancellor reports, adding:

"The only problem is that our political sense of humor (in this country) is not as well developed as is the French."

Each night of the month preceding France's national elections, a TV program poking fun at candidates is broadcast throughout the land.

"It's something we couldn't handle, that we wouldn't tolerate here. I don't think our politicians could stand the heat," he observed, referring to the satire used in presentations dubbed "The Bebette Show."

The program, with Muppet-type characters representing various candidates for the presidency, is the basis for an entire chapter in the book. Other main topics are advertising content, TV news coverage, news magazine coverage, debates, an analysis of the entire campaign, polling and the development of issues.

The 299-page book was published by Praeger of New York City and London as part of its series in political communication.

Sanders was joined by Jacques Gerstle, professor of political science at the University of Poitiers and teacher of political communication at the University of Paris I (Sorbonne) in France, and Lynda Kaid, professor and director of the Center for the Study of Political Communication at the University of Oklahoma. Sanders directed her doctoral dissertation at Southern Illinois University.

Sanders and Gerstle first discussed the idea of the book at an International Communication Association meeting in Montreal in 1987. They decided to pursue the work in 1988 because that was the first time in many years that presidents were elected in the two countries during the same year.

In addition to their own writing, the editors selected contributions from 21 other scholars.

The editors noted that, "One of the most striking differences between campaigns in the United States and France is the variety, intensity and frequency of negative campaigning in the U.S. The 1988 campaigns for president in the U.S. were noted for negativity in speeches and, particularly, in the hard-hitting, personal nature of the Bush commercials....In France, surrogates for candidates sometimes do attack the other candidate, but these attacks usually focus on issue differences and rarely comment on personality traits or the patriotism of the opposing candidate, or call into question the integrity of the opponent."

Some of the major campaign differences cited in the book:

- Thirty-second TV ads are not allowed in France. Stations allocate longer blocks of time to candidates without charge. Meanwhile, Bush and Dukakis spent a total of \$56 million for their TV spots.

- Posters are of considerable importance in French campaigns. They're carefully designed, reproduced in various sizes and used everywhere so citizens are constantly reminded of the candidates.

- Presidential campaigns are far shorter in France, with an official life of one month.

- During debates in France, candidates maintain more control of the programs than their counterparts in the U.S. French candidates respond in a far less programmed style.

- The French offer more variety in press coverage of candidates than the Americans. Major news magazines include noticeable differences in approach in covering people seeking public office.

- Candidates who were not political "insiders" would have much more difficulty pursuing the presidency in France than in the U.S. A Jimmy Carter-type of candidacy, for example, would be unlikely there.

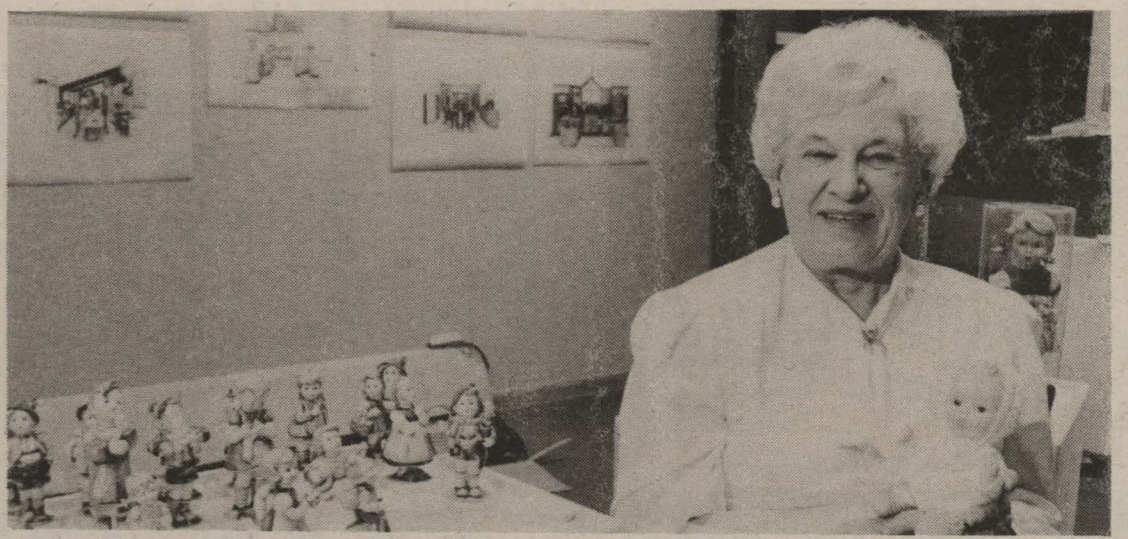
- It's more difficult to buy an election in France, in part because the pervasive electronic media plays a lesser role and special interest groups have less clout than they do in the U.S.

Sanders, who is founder of the Political Communication Division of the International Communication Association, said the book is expected to have its greatest use in higher education, although it is also likely to have broad appeal among the growing number of people who hold positions on the staffs of elected officials in both countries.

Among the most pressing questions about the future of presidential campaigns in the U.S., the chancellor believes, is how to reduce the enormous influence of special interest groups. His recommendation is to limit length and costs of campaigns, which may involve more public financing. But he is doubtful the idea will gain support.

Sanders and the other editors believe the mechanics of campaigning will change in both countries. There will be greater use of videocassette recordings sent to homes of voters to acquaint them with candidate positions. Satellites will be used more extensively to provide live coverage of candidates and link them for mini-debates with their opponents, and international issues will be given greater attention. ■

Language Department receives \$31,000 bequest

A former Park Ridge woman has bequeathed about \$31,000 for special support to the foreign languages program at UW-SP.

Mrs. Irene S. Anderson, who lived at 317 Linwood Ave., stated in her will that the gift is to be used for "whatever purposes that department, in its sole discretion, selects."

Michael Danahy, chairman of foreign languages, said there are many appropriate places where the funds could be used, but he assumed there is major support among the faculty for establishing a student scholarship endowment.

"We are deeply grateful for this generous gift," acknowledged Chancellor Keith Sanders, adding: "There has not been a time in the history of our university when global awareness and foreign language instruction were more important. This gift will help us do an even better job of preparing our students for life in the global village."

Mrs. Anderson died Dec. 1, 1990, at age 77. She and her late husband, Arnold, had lived in Park Ridge nearly all of their married life.

During the early 1950s, Mrs. Anderson became a nontraditional student at UW-SP, taking a particular interest in the study of foreign-languages, notably Spanish. She received a degree in 1957.

Her brother, Ted Meyer of Shawano, said Mrs. Anderson's experiences at the university gave her a considerable amount of personal satisfaction which she mentioned often. ■

Communicative disorders endowment established

The UW-SP Foundation has received a gift of \$20,000 to be used as an endowment for scholarships in communicative disorders at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

The donation from Mrs. Ceal Johnson of Alexian Village, Milwaukee, is a memorial to her late husband, O.K. Johnson, retired president of the Whitefish Bay State Bank. He died in January at 88.

Mrs. Johnson specified that, besides her husband's name, the scholarship also include her name and the names of her son, Gerald F. Johnson, and daughter-in-law, Maxine M. Johnson on the award. Gerald has been a UW-SP speech and language pathology professor the past 29 years, and Maxine has been involved with the public school system in the same field.

Gerald was one of the founders and longtime chair of the university program, now the School of Communicative Disorders, and Maxine was an early master's degree recipient of the program plus the first recipient of the school's Outstanding Alumnus Award. Maxine Johnson's service to UW-SP also included her role in overseeing about 50 students in externship projects in Stevens Point area schools.

The charter for the endowment specifies that recipients of the scholarships be graduate students who have committed themselves to working as speech and language pathologists in a school system. Recipients are to demonstrate clinical flexibility, scholastic achievement, creativity and insight, a keen sense of humor and a genuine liking of children and their caregivers. ■

UW-SP receives rare Hummel collection

An almost complete collection of Hummel figurines and related items have been donated to UW-SP for public display and educational projects.

The gift from Eleanor Goepfert, Rt. 1, Pelican Lake, includes about 400 different Hummel items she has acquired since 1956.

The donor says she is unaware of more complete collections, though she suspects there are some. Included, besides the figurines, are all of the five music boxes ever made, ashtrays, candy dishes, religious statuettes, wall plaques, lamps, bells, dolls, Christmas tree balls, several calendars, and other novelties.

She has purchased all but between 30 and 40 Hummels ever made.

The new home for the display on campus is in a corridor on the first floor of the Professional Studies Building, adjacent to the Agnes Jones Gallery. The collection can be seen whenever the building is open, weekdays and evenings when school is in session and on special occasions during weekends. Cabinetry has been constructed, lighted, and equipped with security measures.

As the collection began to outgrow her farm home, Goepfert said she began pursuing a place where it could be kept permanently for the enjoyment of the general public.

"The university is ideal," she said, adding that she likes the fact the collection will be available for student projects.

Goepfert, a realtor the past 30 years, became a major benefactor of UW-SP in 1988, when she gave its foundation 200 acres of hardwood forest north of Elcho. The land is used by natural resources faculty and students as an outdoor laboratory and an adjunct of the university-operated Treehaven Field Station near Tomahawk.

Goepfert said she had considered stopping her acquisition of Hummels, but when the university became a possible new home, she continued and made arrangements in her will for the collection to be kept up to date in the future.

In the meantime, she has pledged to be personally involved in keeping the display current.

"My house seems pretty empty now, and I'm missing all my boys and girls," Goepfert mused. Consequently, she says she'll probably be visiting the display at the university often.

Knowlton provides history scholarship

The UW-SP Department of History has received a gift of approximately \$11,000 from a professor to support an annual scholarship.

Robert Knowlton, a member of the department faculty for 30 years and longtime chair, sponsored the endowment, which will generate an annual award to be known as the History Department Scholarship.

The recipients are to be upperclass students with overall grade point averages of at least 3.0 and grade point averages in history of at least 3.75.

The first winner of \$500 is Ammar Abdulhamid, a foreign student from Syria. ■

Professor's pride in his school leads to grant

A professor's pride in his school, expressed to a fellow diner at a professional meeting, has resulted in a \$15,000 unsolicited gift for UW-SP.

Ron Crunkilton, a water specialist in the new aquatic toxicology program, was telling an official of Du Pont about innovations that have been made at UW-SP to train specialists in aquatic toxicology on the undergraduate level.

The representative of the chemical company told Crunkilton that such an offering was unique in American higher education, from his perspective, and deserved special support.

But, according to the professor, the Du Pont representative "didn't indicate a thing" about a donation.

Months passed, and this spring the university was informed that it was to send a representative to a meeting in Madison to receive an unsolicited grant

from the chemical firm.

The \$15,000 gift will be used to develop a laboratory to serve the new aquatic toxicology program, which is part of the College of Natural Resources curriculum. ■

they filled five china cabinets.

Drawings of children by a Bavarian nun, Sister Maria Innocentia Hummel, became subjects for the delicately manufactured European figurines in the mid-1930s. Goepfert's mother, Frieda, a native of Germany, purchased several of them on a return trip to her homeland in 1956.

"Appletree Girl and Boy" and "Chimney Sweep" were brought back to northern Wisconsin and given to her only daughter, Eleanor, as souvenirs. A hobby was born.

At first, the purchases were made as gifts for her parents. After her mother died, the collecting became more intense—as a sort of memorial.

Of all the 400 different items in the collection, her favorite is a small, simple figurine of a child tending to a flock of chickens. "Feeding Time" reminds her of herself as a child.

Mary Ann Baird, who heads UW-SP's Division of Fashion and Interior Design, said Goepfert's gift is fast becoming a popular display "because many people are familiar with Hummel figurines and have one or two of their own. Therefore, they have an appreciation for this outstanding and high-quality collection."

She said children in the Gesell Institute for the Study of Early Childhood, whose classroom is near the display, are taking special interest in it, as are her own students in interior design.

Popular interest in Hummels makes the gift particularly special for the university to have. ■

Son, friends honor Mary Samter

An endowment has been established with the UW-SP Foundation to support annual scholarships to future teachers in memory of the late Professor Mary Shorey Samter.

Memorial contributions given by friends at the time of Professor Samter's death last September plus a gift from her son, the Rev. James Samter of Green Bay, were used to establish the \$2,000 fund.

Father Samter further announced his intention to enlarge the endowment through future contributions.

Income from the fund will support scholarship and/or internship awards to upper-level or graduate students majoring in elementary education.

Students eligible for this recognition should demonstrate a strong interest in becoming career classroom teachers and maintain a strong commitment to teaching reading as a central approach to their method of classroom instruction.

Mrs. Samter was a specialist in reading and language arts on the education faculty at UW-SP from 1943 until her retirement in 1973. She was also an alumna of the school, having received her teaching certification in 1927. After her retirement, she lived with her son in Green Bay. ■

Rossmiller fund started

A new scholarship fund has been established at UW-SP to support scholarships for future teachers planning to work with either learning disabled or gifted children.

The Rossmiller Family Award will be given annually in the amount of \$250 by Robert and Elaine Rossmiller of 1817 Portage St.

A total of \$2,500 has been donated by the couple to the UW-SP Foundation to support the award.

Rossmiller is a retired faculty member at UW-SP, and his wife is an alumna and retired public school teacher. From 1965 to 1984, he was a UW-SP professor specializing in education for the gifted and talented. He also served a time as administrator of the financial aids office. His wife received her bachelor's and master's degrees from UW-SP and taught 19 years in the local school system, specializing in learning disabilities, before retiring in 1989.

All of the couple's five children attended UW-SP; four of them are graduates and three of them received preparation here to follow their parents as teachers. ■

An endowment has been established at UW-SP to support an annual Hadrian Manske Poetry Award.

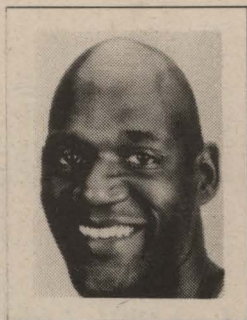

His family and friends provided funds for the poetry award as did the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Co. of Milwaukee. ■

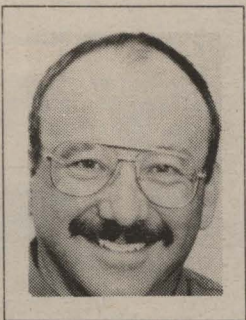

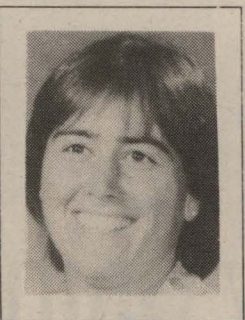

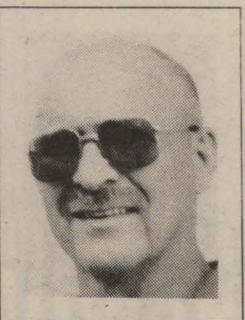

Hall of Fame inducts six

Portland Trail Blazers basketball star Terry Porter was among six honorees inducted into the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point's Athletic Hall of Fame Oct 10th.

Porter, who completed a four-year career with the Pointers in 1985, was cited at the annual UW-SP homecoming with:

Dick Bennett, Pointer basketball coach from 1976 to 1985 with a 174-79 record and now entering his eighth season as coach of the UW-Green Bay Phoenix. He took the Pointers to NAIA national tournaments in Kansas City three times, and went to the final game there in 1984. Terry Porter was one of his players in that game.

Jeff Pagel, a Two Rivers native who was a leading member of the Pointer men's swimming team from 1966 to 1969. He has been employed by the Department of Natural Resources since 1974,

administering local grant programs associated with outdoor recreation. He lives in Ashwaubenon, near Green Bay. A paraplegic since an accident in 1984, he has since become active on the national level on behalf of the handicapped. Most noteworthy are his seven gold medals won in international competition, including the first ever gold medal won by an American cross country skier, able or disabled, in the 1992 winter disabled games in Albertville, France. He also won both the 5K and 10K events and was recognized in 1991 and 1992 as the Disabled Athlete of the Year by American Airlines and in 1992 by the National Handicapped Sports Association.

Quinn Vanden Heuvel, who made 1,112 points as a three-year starter on the Pointer basketball team from 1968 to 1971. He now ranks 12th on the school's list of all-time high scorers. A native of Appleton who has returned to his hometown, he is in his 20th year there

as the quality coordinator at Presto Products Company.

Sue Murphy, a standout in softball and basketball between 1980 and 1984 and holder of several softball records, is a fifth grade teacher and coach at the middle school in McFarland. She is a native of Neenah.

Bernie Christianson, who was a Wisconsin State University Conference heavyweight champion wrestler as a junior in 1964. The native of Eland now lives in Sequim, Wash., where he is involved in heavy construction and land development. He previously was a teacher in New Holstein and Wittenberg. ■

Pointers win All-Sports Trophy

For the first time since 1987, and only the third time in history, UW-SP won the Wisconsin State University Conference All-Sports Trophy, edging UW-Eau Claire 62.5 points to 61. Point won conference crowns in golf, basketball and wrestling and were second in cross country, football and swimming.

Men's Basketball—Enjoying one of the finest seasons in the history of its basketball program, the Pointers won WSUC and NAIA District 14 championships and advanced to the NAIA Division I national tourney in Kansas City. The team finished with a best-ever 27-2 record. Jon Julius was named WSUC and District 14 player of the year while earning NAIA Division I All-American Second Team and GTE Academic All-American Second Team honors. Head coach Bob Parker was honored as WSUC, District 14, Kodak District, and Basketball Times NAIA Coach of the Year.

Hockey—After winning three straight NCAA Division III national championships, the Pointers took runnerup honors in 1992 while advancing to the NCAA championship game for the fourth straight season. UW-SP finished 25-7-4, including NCHA regular season and post-tourney championships. Paul Cauffield was named an All-American for the third straight season, making the first team for the second straight time, while Todd Chin and Mick Kempfer were given second team honors. First-year head coach Joe Baldarotta was named NCHA Co-Coach of the Year.

Wrestling—The Pointers finally achieved their goal of a WSUC championship by easily outdistancing UW-La Crosse by more than 35 points at the WSUC tourney. The crown was the first for UW-SP in 33 years of competition as the squad finished with a 14-4 dual mark. Jeff Bartkowiak, Mark Poirier, Tom Weix, Colin Green and Dennis Aupperle won individual crowns while head coach Marty Loy earned WSUC Coach of the Year honors for the second straight season. At the NCAA Division III nationals, Weix led three Pointer

All-Americans with a runnerup finish while Bartkowiak and Green also were All-Americans.

Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving—The Pointer men closed out one of their most successful seasons with an eighth place finish at the NCAA Division III championships. Both teams finished second at the WSUC/WWIAC relays and the WSUC/WWIAC championships. Amy Hahn, Tracy Beier, Nan Werdin, Tiffany Hubbard and Julie Pausch all earned All-American honors for the women while Matt Boyce, Jerry Curtin, Christian Boyce, Juan Cabrera, Kevin Gelwicks, Brandon Koll, Tim Lehmann, Todd Neuenfeldt, Trot Sibbers and Jay Stevens were All-American for the men.

Women's Basketball—Frustration was a key word for the Pointers throughout the season before they regrouped at the end of the season, winning their last five games and finishing with a 17-8 overall record. The team was 10-6 in the WWIAC. Tricia Fekete and Amy Felauer closed out their careers as the number 2 and number 5 all-time scorers, respectively.

Men's and Women's Track and Field—The highlight of the season came in March as UW-SP hosted the NCAA Division III men's and women's indoor track and field championships in the new Health Enhancement Center. More than 300 athletes competed in the meet. Dean Bryan and Amy Voigt both earned All-American honors, Bryan in the 400m and Voigt in the 800m. The outdoor season was much less eventful as injuries and bad weather hampered the squads.

Softball—A young Pointer squad came up short too often in a 5-22 season. A highlight of the spring came in an exciting 8-7 win over eventual WWIAC champion Platteville in the last week of the regular season.

Baseball—The Pointers had a 20-14 record which marked only the second 20-win season in school history. They were 6-6 in the WSUC Southern Division, good for second place behind perennial champion Oshkosh. ■

O'Brien named athletic director

After serving with an interim appointment in the position since last summer, Frank O'Brien was named in April as athletic director on a permanent basis at UW-SP.

A committee headed by Wayne Gorell made the recommendation after conducting a search. Joan North, dean of the College of Professional Studies, said she was pleased with the recommendation because O'Brien "has done a wonderful job in representing the coaches and maintaining close friendships with the community."

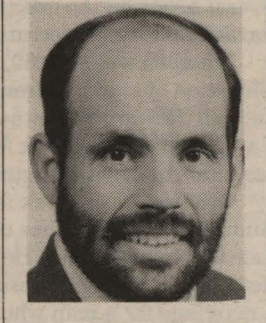
The Pointer athletic program, which includes eight women's and nine men's sports teams, has had one of its best years in school history.

Faculty Obituaries

Gordon Shipman, 91

Gordon Shipman, 91, former chairman of the sociology department at UW-SP, died April 22, 1992 at Fairhaven Retirement Home in Whitewater.

A memorial service was held at the retirement home, and a "celebration" for his family and friends to mark the achievements of his life was held June 7 at Michelsen Hall, on campus. Burial of his ashes was in the village cemetery in Manawa.

Memorials have been established for the UW-SP Foundation for scholarships in sociology and the Fairhaven Retirement Home.

Shipman handled probation/parole duties in Portage, Wood and Waushara Counties, with headquarters in Wisconsin Rapids, from 1934 to 1946. In 1966, he returned to the area as chairman of the department of sociology at UW-SP, retiring in 1971.

He was active here in causes advancing social and economic justice. Largely on the strength of his anti-Vietnam War activity, he was elected a delegate to the 1968 Democratic National Convention in Chicago in support of Eugene McCarthy. Shipman served several terms on the executive committee of the Portage County Democratic Party.

When he was past 80, he and his wife led a delegation of students from UW-SP for a semester of study in Taiwan. That was followed by his completion of a 370-page "Handbook for Family Analysis," which was published by Lexington Press.

One part of the book focused on how positions of children in their families could affect the success of their future marriages. He pointed out, for example, that the oldest sister of brothers is probably best suited in marriage for a man who is the youngest brother of sisters. The oldest brother of brothers, on the other hand, may have the characteristics of being her most undesirable mate.

Lloyd H. Beck, 77

Lloyd H. Beck, 77, first chairman of the psychology department at UW-SP, died April 7 in a nursing home at Neenah.

His funeral was held April 11 at St. Pius Catholic Church in Appleton and burial was in Highland Memorial Park in Appleton.

He served UW-SP from 1964 to 1982, playing a key role in the development of the psychology department and its curriculum. Psychology previously was included in a department that also included instruction in philosophy.

Beck who was a native of St. Louis, received his bachelor's degree from Western Reserve Academy, a master's degree from Oberlin College and a Ph.D. from Brown University.

He became a specialist in visual phenomena and contributed findings for 17 journal articles and 10 classified reports for the federal government.

Beck began his career as a one-half time research physicist and instructor and one-half time psychology instructor at Brown University. He then spent a

T. K. Chang, 81

Professor T. K. Chang, who taught geography at UW-SP from 1956 until his retirement in 1975, died Feb. 19 at St. Michael's Hospital at the age of 81.

His funeral was held at St. Paul's United Methodist Church and burial was in St. Joseph's Catholic Cemetery.

Professor Chang had spent the time since leaving the classroom pursuing his hobby in aesthetic photography. The images he captured of rural life and scenery in Central Wisconsin appear in hundreds of homes, businesses and public buildings.

Born March 6, 1910, in Canton, China, Tsuen Kung Chang earned a bachelor's degree in English literature from Lignan University there, a master's degree in Chinese literature from Yenching University in Peking, and a doctorate in geography from the University of Nebraska.

One of his earliest positions was as an editor for a literary and historical supplement to a newspaper in Canton.

When World War II broke out, he was on the faculty of the University of Hawaii and witnessed the bombing of Pearl Harbor. He was one of the first faculty

Marriage and family were his academic specialties.

Shipman was born in Manawa where he grew up. He graduated from Oshkosh State Normal School with teaching certification in 1922 and then served two years as a math and science teacher at Campbellsport High School.

He did graduate study at UW-Madison, completing his Ph.D. in 1932. College-level teaching jobs were almost nonexistent during the Depression, so Shipman pursued parole work. After 12 years, he had an opportunity to return to higher education with an appointment at Shurtleff College in Illinois. After three years there, he joined the Milwaukee State Teachers College in 1949 and remained for 17 years before coming to Stevens Point. His service in Milwaukee included a five-year stint as chairman of sociology.

He became a leader in several professional societies, including the Wisconsin Family Life Association, which he founded. He also was affiliated with Alpha Kappa Delta Honorary Sociological Association and the National Council of Family Relations.

He was married to Agnes Vanneman, a native of Clifton Forge, Va., on July 20, 1928, and in Stevens Point they lived at 2536 Peck Street prior to moving to Fairhaven at 473 Starin Rd., Apt. 211D, Whitewater, in 1985. The couple spent summers at a cottage on Moose Lake near Phlox.

Besides his wife, survivors include three daughters, seven grandchildren, and one sister. ■

decade, from 1945 to 1955, on the faculty of Yale University as a specialist in vision and olfaction. After his retirement from UW-SP, an annual award to an outstanding student was established in his name.

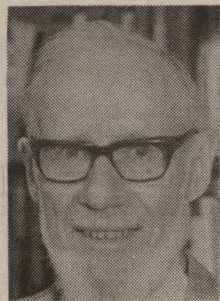
His survivors include his wife, the former Bonnie Zaborski of Stevens Point, whom he married in 1984; two daughters, three sons and six grandchildren. ■

Monte Blue Charles, 62

Monte Blue Charles

Monte Blue Charles, 62, "ringmaster" of UW-SP's "aerial circus" football team during the 1970s, died unexpectedly of a massive heart attack May 8 at his home here.

His funeral and burial were in his hometown of Vicksburg, Mich., and a memorial tribute was held on campus. A memorial fund has been established in the UW-SP Foundation.

Charles ranks among the most successful football coaches ever to serve in the Wisconsin State University Conference, and he was the only person in its history to head teams at three different league schools—Platteville, Superior, and Stevens Point.

He was named Coach of the Year in the WSUC in 1968 after leading the Platteville Pioneers to one of their best seasons on record. At all of the three schools his teams led the NAIA Division I in passing and total offense. His nickname of "ringmaster of the Aerial Circus" was given as a tribute for the thrills he brought Pointer fans with his well-orchestrated passing games while serving here from 1972 to 1977.

Football was Charles' life.

He started competing on the gridiron with classmates when he was 8. He was active in nearly every sport at his high school in Vicksburg, earning 14 letters. At Hillsdale College, he was an All Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association linebacker who played on the only state small college team that participated in a bowl game. The Green Bay Packers drafted him in 1950 and released him three weeks before the start of the 1951 season. He played two years with the semi-pro team, the Detroit Tars.

Before coming to Wisconsin, Charles was a coach and athletic director at Southfield High in Detroit for 10 years, and an assistant at Northern Illinois University for one year.

A bout with leukemia sidetracked him while serving at Stevens Point, but after a convalescence while doing part-time duty in Missouri, he turned to pro ball. He had coaching/scouting stints with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, Saskatchewan Rough Riders, Hamilton Tiger Cats, and the Canada Nine, all in Canada.

In 1988, he returned to Stevens Point to volunteer as an assistant coach for the team that eventually won the national NAIA football title. The following year, he was hired as intramural director and offensive coordinator of the Pointers. For the past year, he was coordinator of recruitment for a NFL team summer training camp at UW-SP.

Charles is survived by his mother in Vicksburg; his wife, Ollie, of Stevens Point; two sons; three step-daughters; and one brother. ■

Faculty Retirements

Eighteen faculty members retired this spring, probably the largest number of professors to do so in the school's history. They are:

Jack Curtis of communicative disorders who has served as his department's computer specialist and has written a book about using computers in his field. He counts outfitting the New Orleans Saints with earplugs and analyzing the mating calls of stone flies as being among his more colorful professional experiences. An avid writer, he has co-authored a textbook about electronic diagnostic instruments, published about 15 professional articles and written many pieces about collectibles. An Ohio native, he has taught at UW-SP for 20 years.

John Gillesby has been the university's "answer man" for 34 years, serving as a reference librarian. A theatre and music buff, Gillesby has appeared on stage in numerous productions and has traveled when possible to hear his favorite operas. During his long tenure here, he also has been a classroom teacher and helped to develop the instructional resources curriculum. A native of Highland Park, Mich., he served for three years on the staff of the Detroit Public Library before coming to UW-SP in 1958.

Gerald Johnson, one of the founders and first chair of the School of Communicative Disorders, completed 29 years of service at UW-SP. He headed his department for 13 years, playing important roles in development of the school's curriculum and its clinic. A native of Whitefish Bay, Johnson was drawn to the field of speech correction because he is a stutterer. About five years ago, he founded the American Institute for the Management of Stuttering. He also is a member of Governor Thompson's Council on Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and a recipient of outstanding alumnus award from Michigan State University.

About half of **Dawn Narron's** 25-year career in education at UW-SP was spent training Native American counselors. She brought more than \$2.5 million to campus through her grant-related training activities. A Wausau native, she began her career as a music teacher and she also has worked with student teachers and their supervisors. She will continue to live in her family home north of Wausau, do some part-time teaching, and visit her former students in Native American communities.

Tom Ryan has had a dual career as an insurance executive at Sentry and as a teacher at UW-SP for 26 years. A specialist in marketing and insurance principles, teaching began as a hobby for him, but became a full-time job after he retired from the insurance industry. A native of Superior, Ryan began working in his father's insurance agency 45 years ago. He served in Germany during the Korean War and for six years during the 1960s, was a traveling instructor for Wisconsin Vocational Schools. In his retirement, he plans to continue his ties to insurance as a consultant.

When asked how he will spend his time after leaving UW-SP, **Bhola Singh's** first answer would be, "playing duplicate bridge." His hobby has brought him major recognition as a master bridge player. In addition, he plans to revise a textbook about Mohandas Gandhi that is used in his home country. A native of Bihar in northeastern India, he has taught in the political science department at UW-SP for 27 years. Singh has been a strong advocate for international education, serving as faculty leader for six semester abroad groups and as the longtime adviser to the student United Nations organization.

John M. Thomas performed a farewell organ recital last fall before leaving UW-SP after 29 years of full-time service. He has prepared scores of organists who now serve churches in a wide area, and he has been the organist at Frame Memorial church in Stevens Point for 21 years. He is the founder and former dean of the Wisconsin River Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. A native of Kansas, he has been a teacher for 37 years and a participant in Boy Scouting for 52 years.

John Zawadsky is a 26-year veteran who helped develop the philosophy curriculum at UW-SP and served as his department's first chair. A specialist in Soviet ideology, he has led five UW-SP student groups to the Soviet Union for spring tours. He also is a former chair of the Faculty Senate and the Graduate Council. Zawadsky is a native of Springfield, Vt., and a veteran of two years in the China Theater at the close of World War II. After retiring, he intends to develop computer software and play video games with his grandchildren.

Robert Knowlton is a specialist in Latin American history who has been on the UW-SP faculty for 30 years. An Ohio native with a doctorate from the University of Iowa, Knowlton has marked his tenure at this school by serving as chair of the history department, chair of the Faculty Senate and as a member of innumerable committees and now the Centennial Planning Committee. He is leaving a gift for UW-SP—a new scholarship fund for history students.

Milo Harpstead is the father of the soil science program at UW-SP. He came here 31 years ago as the fifth member of the conservation department faculty. He was instrumental in developing some of the earliest soils courses here and in formulating the soil science major. Not bad for a South Dakota farm boy whose first job was maintaining tracks for street cars in Minneapolis.

Russell Nelson is a native of Adamstown, Pa., where his family has been in the hat manufacturing business for several generations. At UW-SP for 29 years, Russ has been a specialist in early American history, and has taken particular interest in the life and times of the Native American population. He also has become interested in the history of the environmental movement. Nelson has been active in faculty matters and served as chair of the UW-SP Graduate Council.

Jack Oster has taught political science at UW-SP since the founding of his academic department 30 years ago. He is a native of Cleveland and has made his mark at UW-SP as a specialist in international politics and the Soviet Union. The highlight of his career, he says, was to be a faculty leader for six spring Soviet Seminar tours during a 16-year period. He also participated in the second Semester Abroad program in England and in a tour of mainland China. He and his wife are now looking forward to even more travel.

Raymond Sommers, who was reared in Marshfield and graduated from UW-SP in 1953, is an analytical chemist who has served UW-SP for 30 years. Sommers taught a first-of-a-kind course on campus for paper mill chemists and later was on a committee that planned the major in pulp and paper chemistry. But above all, he has been a family man. And what a family! He is the father of 14 children.

Joseph Harris, a botanist in the Department of Biology, is leaving UW-SP after 27 years. He and his wife, Dorothy, are planning to eventually return to his native Washington, Ga., and live there permanently. Harris promoted the use of the electron microscope among undergraduates and received several honors for his work with that device. He also became widely known as a researcher of the aging process, using tobacco leaves in many of his experiments. He is a charter member and past president of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society at UW-SP.

Marge Miller has been with UW-SP for 21 years during which time she developed the school's programs in early childhood education and early childhood—exceptional education needs. She has estimated that she helped prepare 750 teachers during her career. Miller has won the outstanding service award from the Division of Early Childhood of the Wisconsin Council for Exceptional Children. More time at her piano and electronic organ, jogging, gardening and volunteer projects are among the activities in her retirement plans.

Leon Lewis was a young Marine Corps veteran near Boston when he was recruited off a ball diamond by some World War II buddies to try his hand at

higher education. He liked it and has been in school ever since. After teaching six years at Holy Cross College in Massachusetts, he came to UW-SP in 1965, and has since had the rare distinction of heading two different academic units, English and education, where he is the current administrator. He remembers with fondness the days of full faculty meetings, before the formation of the Faculty Senate and the collegiality of many colorful characters who taught here. Retirement won't take Lewis away from education. He's on the local school board and president of the trustees of the Wisconsin Valley Library Service.

Fred Littmann has served the Counseling Center for 27 years. He is a native of Sheboygan, a veteran of military service, and graduate of UW-Madison who has devoted his entire professional career to this institution. Littmann served many summers as the adviser to incoming students—especially the undeclared.

Roger Wood has spent 25 years at UW-SP involved in training future science teachers. He has been a highly successful grant writer who obtained support from the National Science Foundation, Department of Education, Department of Public Instruction and UW System to enhance science education at UW-SP. A Wausau native and an alumnus of UW-SP, he earned his advanced degrees from UW-Madison. In the 1970s, Wood led a semester in Great Britain, and last year he was recognized by the university for excellence in teaching. ■

Obituaries of Graduates

Glen Calhoun, '91, died in February at age 35 following an automobile accident. A longtime resident of Cambridge, he had served in the U.S. Marine Corps. He is survived by his father, a brother, and four sisters.

Douglas Stephens, '91, collapsed and died while tracking bear in Chequamegon National Forest in northern Wisconsin last January. He was 23. A natural resources graduate student at UW-SP, he had been confirming reports of a bear den in the area. His efforts were part of a research project between UW-SP and UW-Madison which tracked white-tailed deer and black bear predation habits on deer. Apparently, he and a partner went searching for the den and when the two reached the entrance, Stephens fell over dead. His co-worker attempted to revive him and then went for help. His body was found by a search party who followed radio transmission from a radio-collared bear in the den. Stephens had been active in the project for the past two summers and according to one university official "was in excellent shape and apparently his family had no history of illnesses of this nature."

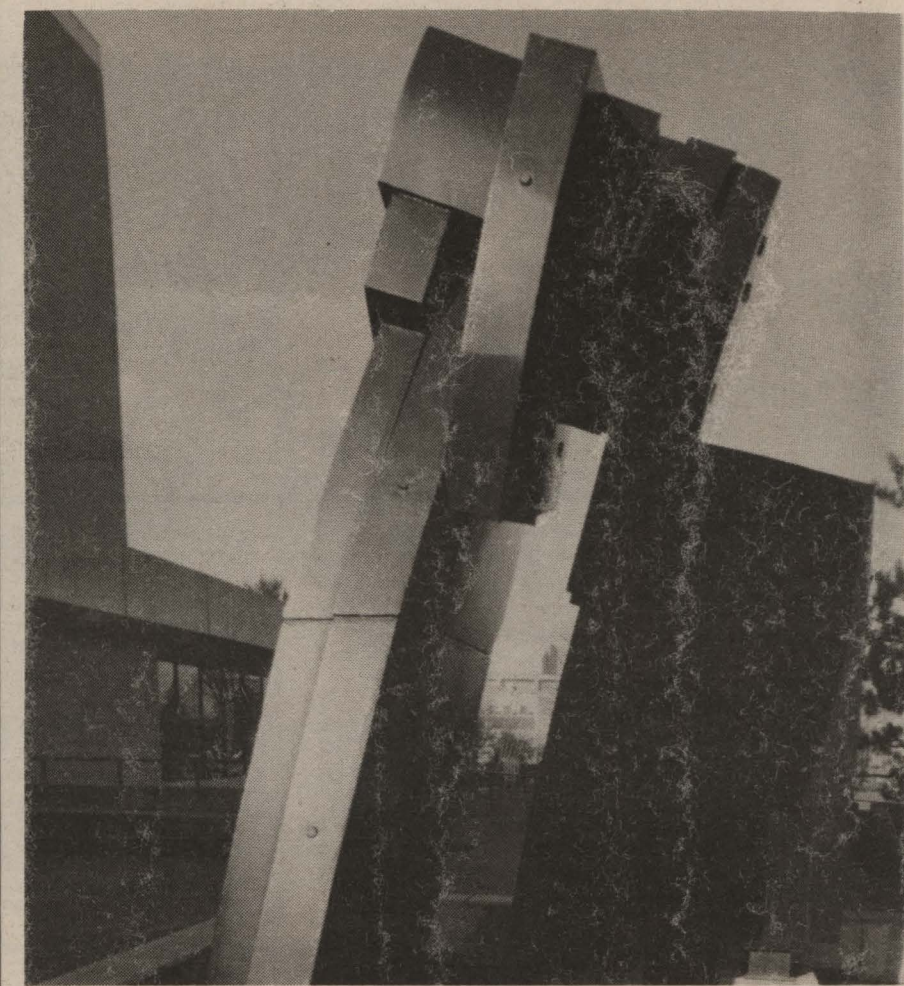

Regnier is the retired director of human resources



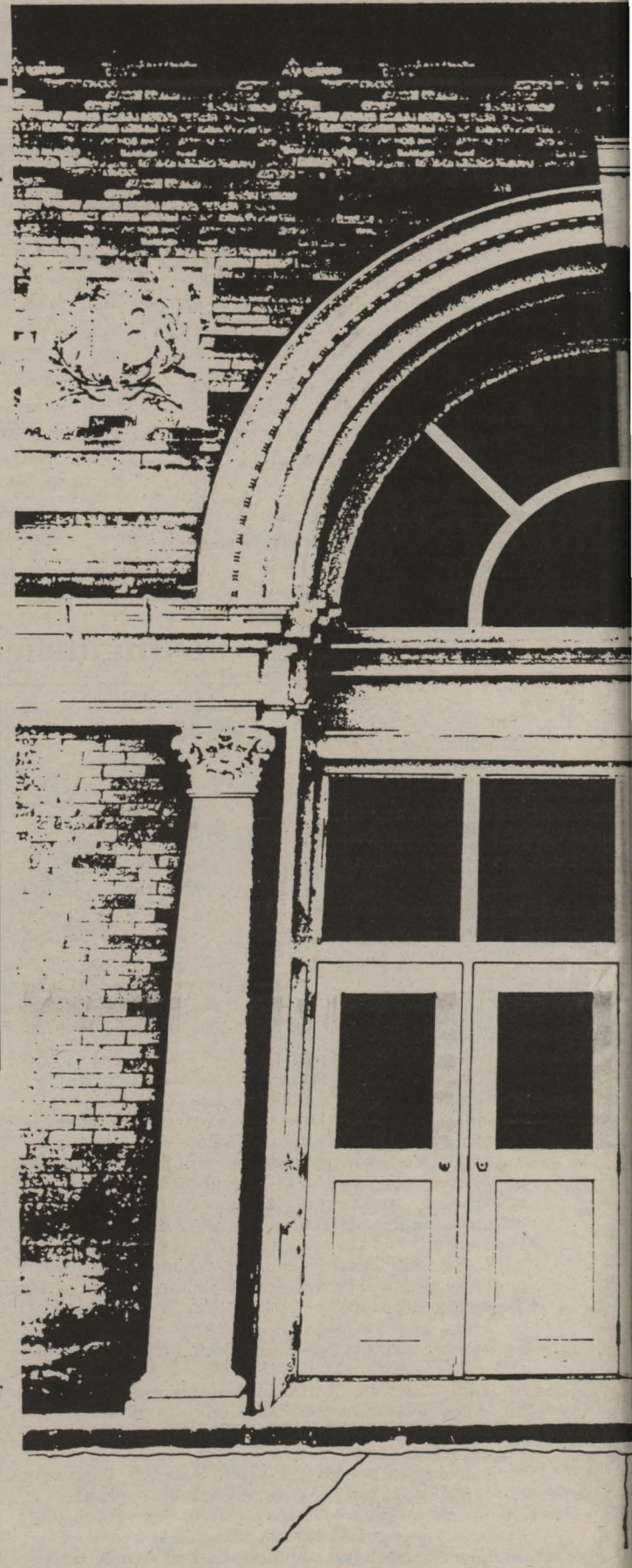

Donations make big difference for UW-SP

More than a decade ago, a wonderful, environmentally-minded couple, Jacque and Dory Vallier, made a major contribution to the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point of some 900 acres of prime woodland near Tomahawk. They also donated funds to help build classroom and dormitory facilities on the property. Soon others began to give, including the Irving L. Young Foundation, Consolidated Papers Foundation, and the Okray family. Now we have one of the finest environmental training facilities located on more than 1,100 acres of beautiful, northern Wisconsin land. It serves groups ranging from those who attend Elderhostel programs to nearly all of the students who graduate from the College of Natural Resources, which has 1,300 students enrolled and is the largest and perhaps the finest college of its kind anywhere in the country. Since the Treehaven facility opened in 1986, more than 37,000 people have used it to learn about the woods, streams, and ecology of Wisconsin.

Were it not for the facility at Treehaven, UW-Stevens Point might not be the Wisconsin Center for Environmental Education. And if we were not the

Wisconsin Center for Environmental Education so designated by the governor and the state Legislature, we might not have been among the top three or four contenders to become the National Center for Environmental Education.

Clearly, gifts make a difference. Gifts beget gifts. Gifts beget grants. Success builds upon success. And the cycle of excellence often begins with a private contribution, as it did at Treehaven.

A second area of gifts which has really made a difference at UW-SP is the scholarship endowment program that we have managed to establish through the generosity of many donors over the past several years. We now offer more than 129 scholarships to students, 97 of which are endowed. Two of them exceed \$100,000, three exceed \$45,000, thirty exceed \$10,000. If you put that all together, we provide total gifts of more than \$1,385,000 to students. These scholarships have done a number of things. First, there are scores of young people who would not be coming to a university as good as UW-Stevens Point without a scholarship. Second, there are a lot of exceptionally bright students whom we have attracted to the university through

scholarship money, who would not otherwise have come. UW-Stevens Point is now in the top three of the 26 campuses in the UW System in the percentage of young men and women who come to us from the top 10 percent of their high school graduating classes. We have come from the middle of the pack to the top three in a relatively short period of time.

Over the decades ahead, philanthropy will have to shoulder an even heavier burden in education. My reasoning here is simple. Other sources of funding for some of the things that we hold dearest in life are going to decline.

Particularly, I am talking about federal grant dollars and dollars from state government. I am invited to Washington every few months to sit on various national councils having to do with the relationship between higher education and politics. I serve, for example, on the Commission on Governmental Relations for the American Council on Education. During my last visit to Washington, I had the chance to spend some time talking to Dr. Robert Reischauer, director of the Congressional Budget Office. He made a brief speech which turned out to be one of the most depressing after-dinner speeches I have ever heard. He said

that if we consider all government policies which are now in place: the discretionary caps on spending, the Desert Storm impact on the federal budget, the off-budget surpluses in Social Security, the Postal Service and so on; if we take all of that into account, by 1997 the Federal deficit will be 3.1 percent of the gross domestic product. In 1991, it was 2.9 percent of the gross domestic product. Of every four dollars that the federal government now spends, one dollar is borrowed. This simply cannot continue.

I foresee that the National Science Foundation and other granting agencies important to education will become less able to support us over the course of the next decade. I also believe that the quality and amount of student aid in the form of grants and loans available to our students will diminish from federal and state sources over the same period, even though we have recently experienced a slight increase.

At the state level, financial pressures are probably not quite as severe as they are at the national level. Still, problems exist. For example, in the 1973-74 fiscal year, the UW System received 49.9 percent of its annual operating budget from general purpose revenue, or in other words, from tax dollars. In 1991-92, the UW System received 34.9

After verifying the eligibility of the donor and recipient organization, the company then makes its matching gift. ■

Wisconsin's public universities are increasingly becoming tax assisted instead of tax supported institutions of higher learning. Consequently, your financial support is all the more important in our quest to retain the margin of excellence for which UW-SP has become so well known. ■
